



2. **Example answers:** Outdoor working, some physical strength, mapping skills, computer skills, problem solving, knowledge of peat bogs, communication, health and safety, decision making, driving, time management, budgeting etc.
3. If peatlands are not restored, they won't be able to take in any more carbon dioxide and will release carbon dioxide and contribute to climate change.
4. People can damage peatlands by building on them, farming on them or generally disturbing the land. Other animals could also damage the land by overgrazing, such as cows.
5. The work won't begin until September because it's bird breeding season before then, and the work should avoid disturbing this.
6. To restore the peatland, mosses will be planted on top of exposed peat and ditches around the peat will be filled in to stop water easily draining away.
