


Can you draw plates on the Stegosaurus?



How many teeth do you have?




The Spinosaurus was larger than a T. rex and may have been the largest meat-eating dinosaur ever!


This Hadrosaur is camouflaged amongst the trees. Colour it in so it can hide!

This Hadrosaur wants to stand out to warn off other Hadrosaurs. Colour it in so it makes a display!






The Apatosaurus is one of the largest animals to have ever walked the Earth!





The largest tooth of any carnivorous dinosaur found to date belonged to a T. rex – roughly the same size as a 30cm ruler!






